Travelling to and from school

Unfortunately, we have recently had a number of incidents where our students have not taken care when crossing roads correctly and sensibly following some simple rules relating to their personal safety when travelling to and from school. We will be ensuring that a clear message goes out to all our students over the next few weeks. However, I would appreciate your support in reinforcing guidance in relation to some basic personal safety issues.

Firstly, students who wear headphones whilst walking to and from school should take extra care as they often do not hear vehicles approaching when they are crossing the road.

Secondly, all student who cross the A13 should do this via the designated underpass and under no circumstances attempt to go across via the central reservation.

Thirdly, those students who ride to school should take great care to be fully aware of other vehicles on the road and pedestrians on the pavements.

Your support in reinforcing these guidelines is much appreciated and I'm sure you will realise how important it is for all our young people follow these basic road safety rules.

In addition to this, if your child travels to and from school by car, could you please ensure that you do not double park outside the school when dropping them off or picking them up as this causes congestion for other road users and is a safety concern for students crossing the road.

Important Information for the parents/carers of Year 9 students

As you will be aware **all** students are required to have a valid Passport and European

Health Insurance Card (EHIC) for all European school trips abroad **including** day trips. As Year 9 will be visiting Ypres in October 2017, this notice is to give you advance warning that your son/daughter will need to bring these documents to school for photocopying by Monday 2nd October 2017 in order to participate in this trip. The EHIC card is free and is valid for five years. If your child does not already have an EHIC card, please apply:

- On-line <u>www.ehic.org.uk</u> (Please use this website address. We have been advised to inform you not to Google EHIC as the official website may not be the first link to appear and other websites for EHIC may charge for the card!) or
- by calling 0845 606 2030, or
- by picking up an application form from the Post Office.

In order to apply, please ensure you have the NHS or National Insurance Number, Surname/Family Name, Forenames and Date of Birth of each applicant.

Note: If we received a copy of your child's passport/EHIC whilst they were in Year 7 for the trip to France in July 2016 and these are still in date, we DO NOT need to see them again.

Physics trip to Cambridge University



On Wednesday 20th September, a group of Year 11 students went on a trip up to Cambridge University for a Physics at Work exhibition. In the morning, students visited Gonville and Caius College, which is one of the oldest Colleges at the University, founded in 1348. During a tour, the students visited an elegant library, lecture halls and Stephen Hawking's office as well as learning about daily life at university.

After a fine lunch served in the traditional dining hall, students visited the Cavendish Laboratory for an afternoon of exploring. In groups, they visited various events and discussions about fossil fuels with BP. They were involved in dismantling and reassembling a model jet engine with Rolls Royce, innovative research on radio astronomy and some liquid nitrogen demonstrations. Overall students enjoyed the day and were inspired by the current research in the field of physics.
