

### Opportunities in year 9

The below map demonstrates how we develop our young people throughout year 9, it is important to remember that year 9 brings the necessary development of decision-making skills. In year 9 students must choose their GCSE options that they will keep until they leave us in year 11, consequently a large part of our time in year 9 is spent focussing on this. Below you will be able to see details on how we are supporting the students to succeed in making appropriate, realistic and considerate choices for their GCSE's.

There are a number of means of supporting students with their options:

- Tutor time activities
- Assemblies
- Progress Evening
- Options Evening
- University led programmes
- Mentoring in school from universities
- Careers meetings
- Other externally sourced programmes
- Large internal provision across the year and pastoral teams

Alongside this, the year 9 cohort will also work through the 'Character is Key' skills across the year; the ways in which we do this are also detailed below:

- Half termly competition to outline 'What R.....means to me?' which is rewarded with inter-form points and a small prize
- Discussion mornings during AM registration about what the character skill means
- Half termly assembly led by form tutors called 'Meet the team', during the assembly the tutor talks through their life. This includes their success, failures and future goals, whilst talking through these tutors will reference to the character skill of each half term to show where they have learnt the skill throughout their life
- Students will be asked to write down who they think possesses each skill during the half term and why they think so
