Holidays during term time

In line with legislation, we are expected to take a strong stance towards holiday taken during term time.

As with other schools in the local vicinity, JRCS will now be issuing fines on a regular basis to parents who have taken their child out of school for a holiday. We do understand how difficult it can be due to the costing and increase in price. This is out of our control. As a school community we have parents who work within our system at all different levels who unfortunately also have to abide by the legal requirement. When unauthorised holiday is taken, your child will also be excluded from attending any extracurricular activities for a period of 6 months following the leave.

We understand there may be times when circumstances may arise where leave is unavoidable. In these situations we require as much proof as possible, this enables the school to make a fair decision as to whether the absence was truly unavoidable and should be authorised.

- If flights are booked in an emergency situation or bereavement, proof of when flights were booked
- If taken ill while away preventing return to school on time, then a copy of medical documentation needs to be provided.

If your child fails to return following a leave of absence and the school is not provided with requested information, the school's Attendance Manager will liaise with the local authorities Children Missing Education Officer. This will result in a fine being issued and in some cases after prolonged absence your child may lose their school place

Last week, on 9th October, the Business Department organised an incredibly enriching trip to an internationally recognised firm; Clifford Chance. A group of Year 11 students, who currently study GCSE Business were able to travel to London's heart of finance, Canary Wharf.

Upon arrival, we were greeted by the tranquil atmosphere. At first we were taken to one of the conference rooms, where the enrichment activities would take place. However, many students said their favourite part was the guided tour of the firm. We learnt about the different sectors at Clifford Chance; from Capital Markets to general finance. We also had the fantastic opportunity of talking to some solicitors, who were able to give us valuable advice, and a genuine insight into their job. Learning that most simply did the EPQ, assured us that we still have plenty of time to choose our paths. We were also able to bombard them with questions about how they got to where they are, which also helped us to consider the skills needed to be successful.

Muslim Student Panel Event

On Saturday 28th September I went to the Muslim Student Panel. The first activity was a Q and A session with students from a variety of faculties. During this session we were able to ask questions for example " How are you able to manage your time to pray 5 times a day?" and "What A-Level grades are required in order to get into one of the Russell Group Universities?"

In my opinion I thought that lunch time was the best memory I had from this experience. This was because at lunch time everyone got together boys and girls, men and women and we all prayed together which was led by one of the male lecturers there. I was shocked to hear how Muslim individuals were able to pray in the middle of their lectures and the professors would not mind. Instead, some of the Muslim professors would encourage the students to pray and remind them when they needed to. Everyone there wase very helpful and respectful to the views of others. They were very religious using Islamic words such as InShaAllah, MaShaAllah and Assalamualaikum.

Later, we had a networking session; I spoke to one of the medical students who studied at Imperial College London. The medical student I spoke to was from Chelmsford and we had many similarities such as the people who we watch on YouTube. She also spoke to me about attending lectures which were open to everyone to attend and how that would enable me to build my confidence. We spoke about what grades are required in A-Level for medicine. In addition to this we spoke about what type of questions are asked in interviews and how

some universities base it on the outcomes of your learning whereas others base it on academics results. Finally, we finished off with advice on how to write a personal statement; how to not over complicate your statement and using a dictionary in order to find more sophisticated words which are unfamiliar to you.

After this session I felt honoured and very thankful for being able to attend an event like this as it encourages people of all races to attend universities and how to enjoy the University life.
