If they wish to, they may bring water, but this needs to be in a clear plastic bottle with the label removed. Please note the different start times to some exams (named AA) for students with access arrangements. Please remind your child that under no circumstances should mobile phones be taken into exam rooms. If your child is unable to attend any of their exams, please call the attendance line as usual.

We do not want students to be anxious about not being in school for their mock exams if they are following guidance around isolation. We will ensure that arrangements are made for students to complete exams on their return to school in this instance.

Read It

Avarice

Define it:

A desire to gain or possess wealth; a craving for money.

Digging Deeper:

People often mix the noun avarice with greed, thinking they are interchangeable. As nouns, the difference between avarice and greed is that **avarice** is excessive or inordinate desire of gain; greediness after wealth, while **greed** is a selfish or excessive desire for more than is needed or deserved. While this could include wealth, it could also be status, power or possessions!
