Year 9 options/EBacc

Assemblies and tutor time activities are currently underway to help support Year 9 students through their GCSE options process. Students have already heard from a number of GCSE subjects in assembly to find out what KS4 study looks like in each subject, and this will continue over the coming weeks. Options booklets will be coming home shortly, detailing every GCSE course on offer at JRCS.

Our school motto, Success for All, means that we strongly believe in offering a wide and varied curriculum with appropriate pathways and choices for every individual student in our care. Please spend some time going through the information in the booklet with your son or daughter, and discussing with them which GCSE subjects are best suited to their interests, strengths, and future plans. Their teachers and form tutors will also be having these conversations with every student.

One thing we are very keen to drive forwards at JRCS is the number of our students opting to

study the English Baccalaureate (EBacc). The EBacc is not a qualification in itself, but rather a group of GCSE subjects which are looked on very favourably by universities and which open doors for future career and life prospects. You don't need to have studied all of these subjects to go to university, but having your GCSE mix based on the EBacc subjects will provide you with a really strong academic grounding and will help to keep your options open as you progress on to sixth form and beyond.

Studying the EBacc means taking GCSEs in all of these subjects:

- English Language and Literature
- Maths
- The Sciences
- History or Geography
- A modern foreign language, or a community language

Certainly for Year 9 students who are targeted to achieve Grades 5 and above at GCSE, they should be strongly considering picking options which centre around the EBacc.

Students will attend SLT interviews and submit their options choices at the Year 9 Progress' Evening on Wednesday 23rd February 2022. If you have any questions or require further information about GCSE options before then, please contact the Year 9 team.

Year 11 mocks and Easter Revision School

This is such a key time for our Year 11 students as they enter the final months before their GCSE exams. Students will sit their final mock exams before the Easter holidays, and should now be spending time reviewing their work carefully and understanding exactly how to move their grades forwards to ensure success with their exam results this summer.

The Year 11 mock timetable is currently being finalised. Once it is published, students should use this to plan their time carefully, and should be undertaking several hours a week of revision and independent study at home. Students should also plan to attend Easter Revision School during the Easter holidays. This is a vital opportunity for our students and attending the revision workshops offered by our staff often makes a huge difference to students' final grades. Further information on both the mock exams and Easter Revision School will be sent home shortly by the Year 11 team.

Covid Catch-up: Saturday tutoring



On 2nd February it was an absolute pleasure to host Tim Stillwell at our Year 10 assembly. Tim Stillwell is a very successful entrepreneur who started his business whilst still in full time education which has

continually grown since then. He shared his story with our students and highlighted his life lessons, like resilience and taking opportunities, which led him to where he is now. As part of the partnership with The JRCS Enterprise Provision and Miss Ryzak, he offered a highly valuable contribution to making our Enterprise Zones a true Entrepreneurship Hub.





The opportunity launch for Year 10 students is an International Fair event which will take place between the 1st and 3rd March, in the Enterprise Zone 4. The best entrepreneurs in Year 10 will be selling their ideas under Keane's Canopy in Enterprise Zone 4, and will have the ability to

try out their business skills as well as showcase their idea to the whole school community. The biggest advantage this would provide is that the entrepreneurs get to keep 75% of all profit and develop their skills and talents which can create further future opportunities

On Monday, an application form will be sent out to all Year 10 students, accompanied by a worksheet to allow students to plan and test their ideas.

To apply they must submit a video pitch and the filled-out application form to Miss Draisey by the 21st February 2022. For feedback the form must be submitted by the 10th February. Good luck to all aspiring business entrepreneurs in Year 10, as best ideas will be granted a trading license and each participant can apply for a loan, around £25 per business to start off their business.

Year 10 RPC Mentoring

Students who were interested then needed to complete a 2-page application form to be sent to their Head of Year.
