My Child At School app - for parents of students in Years 7-10

I am pleased to announce that we are launching a school app, MCAS ('My Child at School - Bromcom parent portal). This app will be available on iOS and Android. After the Easter holiday, this will be our mainstream form of communication between school and home.

We will send you information on how to download the app (this will also be available on our website), along with your own login details before the end of term. We ask that you please download and set up the app during the Easter break. Please enable push notifications when you set this up, as this will ensure you receive important school information as soon as it's sent out. The app will show your son/daughter's timetable, give you instant notification of positive letters of commendation, exam timetables and allow you to amend contact details with much more to come over the coming months!

Changes to the school day

Please be aware that we will be returning to our normal school day times after the Easter holiday. This means all students, in every year group, must arrive at school at 8.30am in time to reach their tutor rooms by no later than 8.35am. Failure to arrive at their form time classroom or assembly lines by 8.35am will be

classed as them being late to school, and will result in a 20 minute detention.

Students then created 'personal shield' resources helping them to think about long and short term goal setting, and got the chance to meet their mentors online ahead of the future sessions which will take place in school and at the RPC offices in London.

- 4 MenACWY protects against 4 strains of the meningococcal bacteria – A, C, W, and Y – which cause meningitis and blood poisoning (septicaemia)
