Letter to parents

My Child At School app

After the Easter holiday, the MCAS app will become our mainstream form of communication between school and home. Please ensure that you download the app onto your phones over the Easter holidays and enable push notifications when you complete the set up.

Changes to the school day

Please be aware that, after Easter, morning registration begins for all students, in every year group, at 8:35am. Failure to arrive in their form classroom or assembly lines by 8:35am will be classed as students being late to school, which will result in a 20 minute detention.

We strongly advise that all students arrive on site by 8:30am to make sure they get to form rooms on time.

Year 12 London Zoo Trip

On the 23rd March, the Psychology department took Year 12 students to visit London Zoo where we had the opportunity to take part in an 'Animal Intelligence' workshop.



In this workshop we explored how animals learn through the principles of social learning theory, e.g., how some find it much easier to imitate role models than others. We were also shown a few examples of this type of learning by the zookeepers where they had squirrel monkeys mimic certain shapes and get rewarded with food afterwards which made them more likely to repeat the shape task to continually be rewarded (positive reinforcement).

They also encouraged us to try this with a partner where one of us was an animal (gorilla) and the other a zookeeper and the zookeeper had to create a set of steps in order to encourage the animal to perform a certain

behaviour to receive a reward, which in the animal's case was a banana.

This workshop linked well with our approaches in Psychology lessons and was really interesting and informative. Throughout the day we had the chance to walk around the zoo and see many animals which was really fun especially because it was incredibly sunny which made it even more enjoyable. Overall it was a really fun and exciting experience.

Letter to Parents from Matthew Cole, Director of Public Health, London Borough of Barking and Dagenham

I am writing to you to ask for your support in helping us protect more teenagers in Barking and Dagenham against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Polio and Meningitis.

This year the current uptake of these immunisations is lower than it has been in previous years. Low levels of immunisation put children and young people at risk of getting these serious diseases – however it is not too late to change this.

As part of the national immunisation programme, teenagers in Year 9 are required to get the 3-in-1 booster and the Meningitis ACWY vaccines in addition to the HPV vaccine in Year 8. These vaccines have been used for decades as an effective way of protecting teenagers against a whole range of dangerous diseases such as Tetanus, Diphtheria, Polio, Meningitis and several types of cancer.

Meningitis is an inflammation of the lining of the brain which causes long-term problems and can be fatal. Tetanus, Diphtheria & Polio are three separate diseases which can cause problems such as difficulty breathing and swallowing, muscle spasms and a high temperature. Not getting the vaccine could lead to your child becoming very unwell. You can read more about both vaccines and the diseases they protect against below:

Parental consent

To support us in protecting more teenagers against these serious diseases, we ask that parents or carers who haven't yet completed the online consent form do so by visiting https://london.schoolvaccination.uk/dtp/2021/barkinganddagenham

It is important to do this even if you choose not to consent to your teenagers' vaccination.

If you require a paper consent form, please contact Holly Westfallen at Vaccination UK who will be able to provide this. Her contact details are included at the end of this letter. It's not too late for your child to get vaccinated

If your child hasn't already received these immunisations, it's not too late for them to do so. Please complete the online consent form or contact Vaccination UK if you require a paper









consent form. Vaccination UK will either arrange a date to go back into your child's school or alternatively you can attend one of the drop-in clinics taking place across the borough.
