Please note that we have changed the start of our school day. All students are required to be at school for an 8.30am start time. The school day now ends at 4.05 pm on a Monday and 3.05pm on a Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. We will finish at 1.40pm on a Wednesday.

Can I remind parents about uniform requirements. Students should have a knee length skirt or tailored trousers. Leggings and tight trousers are not allowed. KS3 should wear a grey seagull top and KS4 students a blue seagull top. Students are only allowed a school jumper and students should have a proper coat. Hoodies and tracksuit tops are not permitted. Students should not be wearing trainers and should have proper school shoes. Please ensure students do not wear jewellery to school. If your child is going to get their ears pierced, then this should be done at the start of the holidays as students will be asked to remove piercings in school. Any students with incorrect uniform or who is wearing jewellery will be educated in the Standards Room.

Next year we are having a real focus on homework. This is to ensure your child is ready for the demands of their GCSE exams and have developed good study habits. As such, the student planner will be really important. We will no longer be supplying temporary planners as we want students to value their school planner. Any student who loses their planner will be educated in the Standards Room until they find it or replace their lost planner. Please talk to your child about the importance of looking after their planner next year.

May I take this opportunity to thank parents and carers for all their support this year. I hope you all get a restful break and enjoy the Summer!
