#### Arrangements for the last day of term

The last day of term, Friday 18th July, will be a non-school uniform day. Students are asked to bring a £1.00 donation for charity if they wish to be in non-school uniform. #### **Uniform Expectations**

We are committed to maintaining high standards, and this includes our school uniform. Please ensure that your child returns in full school uniform in September. Please remember that jewellery is not permitted at JRCS so if students have piercings they will be asked to remove them. Therefore, if your child is planning on getting a piercing over the summer, then this should be done at the start of the

holidays so it has time to heal for September, and any jewellery can be removed.

#### **Mobile Phone Policy**

From September 2025, mobile phones will be banned in school and Castle Green reception. If a student brings a phone into school a second time it may be confiscated for 5 days. Please support us by ensuring that students do not bring mobile phones into school.

On Friday 13<sup>th</sup> June, our Year 10 Geography students ventured out to Stratford to complete the fieldwork component of their paper 3 exam.






The visit concluded with valuable application support and pathways information from The Royal Veterinary College, Nottingham and Lancashire Universities, helping our students plan their future in veterinary science.

# A Year of Stories, Sharing, and Success in the Library

As the academic year draws to a close, we're celebrating a vibrant and inspiring year in the school library, filled with books, creativity, and community spirit.

# KS3 Book Club: A Journey into the Mysterious

Our KS3 Book Club met every Wednesday afternoon, diving into a range of exciting reads. The standout favourite this year was *Hold Back the Tide* by Melinda Salisbury — a chilling and atmospheric tale set in the remote Scottish Highlands. The story follows Alva, a girl living with a dark secret: her father is a murderer. But as strange things begin to stir in the loch and the village, Alva discovers that the real danger may be far more ancient and terrifying than she ever imagined.

# KS4/5 and Staff Book Club: Powerful and Provocative Reads

Older students and staff explored deeper themes through two standout novels. *The List* by Yomi Adegoke sparked powerful discussions about online culture, privacy, and the impact of social media. It follows Ola, a journalist whose life is turned upside down when her fiance's name appears on a viral list of alleged abusers — a gripping and timely exploration of truth, trust, and accountability.

We also read 10 Minutes, 38 Seconds in This Strange World by Elif Shafak, a poignant and lyrical novel that begins in the final moments of a woman's life. As her brain continues to function for ten minutes and thirty-eight seconds after death, she reflects on her life in Istanbul and the friendships that gave her strength. A moving tribute to memory, resilience, and the power of human connection.

Readathon Success: Year 7's Big Heart In a heartwarming show of generosity, Year 7 students took part in a Readathon, raising over £100 for a charity that provides books to children in hospital for extended stays. A huge thank you to everyone who participated and supported this meaningful cause.

World Book Day: A Celebration of Stories
World Book Day was a tremendous success!
Staff dressed up as beloved book characters
and shared stories throughout the day, creating
a joyful and literary atmosphere across the
school. The highlight was a visit from acclaimed
author Caroline Green, who has written

numerous stories and novels for both children and adults. She worked with 60 students from Years 8 and 10, leading creative writing workshops and sharing her insights into storytelling.
